It is with deep regret that, I announce the passing of Real Daughter Cora Lee Johnson-Jackson a resident of Washington D.C. and active supporter of the Lincoln-Cushing Camp #2. Cora Lee Johnson-Jackson was born on 20 June 1919 and was the 14th child of Pvt. Alonzo Johnson. Pvt. Johnson was a member of Company F, 45th U.S. Colored Infantry Regiment, a unit which was part of the 25th Corps. Pvt. Johnson saw service in the final campaigns of the Civil War and was present at Appomattox Court House on 9 April 1865. The passing of Cora Lee Johnson-Jackson is one more reminder that we are losing the last living links to the men of the Civil War; she leaves a legacy of commitment that will be carried into the future by her nephew our SUVCW Brother Ricardo Johnson.
