- 3. Therefore, effective immediately, all Camps within the Department of Maryland must establish and maintain a Camp Webpage that has the following information prominent thereon:
  - The Names and contact information for the Camp Commander, Camp Secretary and /or any member responsible for recruiting new members at your camp,
  - Important events occurring within the Camp and programs/projects underway or accomplished by the Camp and its members,
  - Other special SUVCW related information about activities within the Camp,
  - A link to Camp and Department officers who can respond to public requests for information or support,
  - The meeting time and place of the Camp,
  - Camps must provide a link from its site to the Department web site and optionally to the National web site.
  - The Harpers Ferry At-Large Camp must provide a link to the National Web Site.
- 4. Camps without the technical expertise or necessary resources to start a website are to contact our Department Signals Officer, Brother Holcombe, who is ready and willing to create your site for you by providing the above information to him.
- 5. The days of paper books and news are quickly ending. We must keep pace with the changing culture in our nation and mainstream way of communicating today!
